## Allied Health Research Symposium Peer Support for Critical Care Survivors A/Prof Kimberley Haines

Kimberley Haines is a clinician-researcher and Physiotherapy Research Lead at Western Health. Kimberley is also a clinical associate professor in the Department of Critical Care, School of Medicine, at The University of Melbourne, where she is currently undertaking her NHMRC Investigator Grant, to continue her post-doctoral research in ICU recovery. A/Prof Haines is an emerging national and international leader in the field of critical care survivorship, as well as in the use of co-design and qualitative methods in vulnerable cohorts.

A/Prof Haines is recognised as a global authority on post-ICU care with 48% of her publications in the top 10% most cited publications worldwide. A/Prof Haines has attracted a career total of >\$8.5M in funding including competitive international grants from the US Society of Critical Care Medicine, NHMRC, and MRFF and has 90 peer-reviewed publications. A/Prof Haines was lead editor for one book, authored two book chapters, contributed to a national sepsis policy report and led Allied Health in writing for the ANZICS COVID-19 Guidelines.
