One grant transforming care across different areas

The Collier Charitable Fund supports initiatives that improve the health and wellbeing of patients and staff in Victorian public hospitals. A generous **\$39,285** grant to Austin Health has helped bring three important initiatives to life, supporting patients of different ages and needs across our health service.

CREATIVE SUPPORT DURING THE SCHOOL HOLIDAYS



The Adolescent and Child Eating Disorders School Holiday Program provides therapeutic activities for young patients when the Austin School is closed. Over the past year, five facilitators delivered 44 sessions featuring art, ceramics, jewellery making, music therapy and more. These activities help young people cope with the stress of being in hospital, stay engaged with their treatment and experience moments of creativity, enjoyment and connection.

A new portable Airvo 3 Non-Invasive Ventilation machine is helping Austin Health's Critical Care Outreach Physiotherapy team support patients experiencing respiratory deterioration outside the Intensive Care Unit (ICU). The device has already enabled four patients with high spinal cord injuries to safely move from ICU to a calmer ward environment. It has also helped three critically unwell patients transition successfully from ventilators to breathing independently, allowing them to leave ICU sooner and continue their recovery on the ward.



SUPPORTING SAFER BREATHING CARE

MAKING MEMORY REHABILITATION MORE ACCESSIBLE



MemoRehab is a six-week memory training program for people with acquired brain impairment whose memory concerns affect daily life. Collier's support funded a two-year software licence, laptop and headset, helping patients participate online or onsite. To date, four groups have completed the program through a flexible hybrid model, with participants gaining practical memory strategies and greater confidence. Every participant said they would strongly recommend the program to others.



Unveiling of Impella machine with clinicians

Helping hearts when every moment counts

Last month, our Cardiac Unit received new Impella equipment, made possible by the generosity of our donors. Valued at approximately \$138,000, the Impella is a small device that temporarily helps the heart pump blood around the body. It can support patients experiencing severe heart failure or undergoing high-risk heart procedures.

The device provides another treatment option when our existing form of heart support may not be suitable. It will help our cardiac team safely care for a broader range of patients and may reduce time spent in hospital and intensive care. We are deeply grateful to our donors for helping bring this advanced, life-saving technology to Austin Health.

Giving back with gratitude

After spending more than 100 days receiving treatment for Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia at the Olivia Newton-John Cancer & Wellness Centre, Stefan Mason knows firsthand the difference compassionate care can make. Today in remission, he is passionate about ensuring others facing cancer have access to the same life-changing support.

To give back, Stefan recently hosted *With Stefan*, a special community fundraising event that brought together family, friends and business partners for an evening of generosity, great food and heartfelt connection. Thanks to donated auction items, generous supporters and an incredible community spirit, the event raised an extraordinary **\$66,682.18** for the ONJ Centre.

"Cancer care isn't just about medicine," Stefan said. "It's about people, how you're supported mentally, emotionally and physically every step of the journey. This is exactly why we chose the ONJ Centre to fundraise for."

A NEW CHAPTER FOR ENDOSCOPY AT AUSTIN HEALTH

Join us for our **final** **Olivia's Walk for Wellness** A place to breathe and begin again



This October, our community will come together for the very last time for Olivia's Walk for Wellness, celebrating Olivia Newton-John's extraordinary legacy and raising funds to ensure people facing cancer can continue to access vital wellness support.

For Elise Cameron, that support has made an immeasurable difference. Looking out over the gardens from the Wellness Centre, Elise found something she desperately needed during treatment: a place where cancer did not consume every part of her day.

Elise was diagnosed with breast cancer in early 2024. Since then, the 46-year-old has faced six weeks of radiation therapy, four rounds of chemotherapy, a double mastectomy, full lymph node removal and, more recently, breast reconstruction surgery.

Cancer changed almost every part of her life. Elise lost her business, her fitness and many of the social connections that had once filled her world. With long periods spent at home alone, she often felt isolated.

Throughout her treatment, Elise accessed psychology, massage, exercise physiology, yoga and medical acupuncture through the Wellness Centre. She continues to use some of these services today.

Yet the Centre offered her more than a program of care. On long days between appointments, it gave Elise somewhere calm and welcoming to go. Other parts of the hospital became connected with chemotherapy and some of her most difficult experiences. The Wellness Centre felt different. It was a place to take a breath, look out over the gardens and find comfort away from the clinical side of treatment.

Often, it was the simplest gestures that meant the most. A conversation with a staff member, a cup of tea offered by a volunteer or a safe place to sit helped Elise feel less alone during the darkest period of her life.

While her medical team treated her cancer, the Wellness Centre helped her rebuild her confidence, reconnect with others and gradually rediscover a sense of normality. Elise believes she would not be where she is today without that support.

“

The wellness center gave me back being a person again. My whole life has changed. I am a completely different person to who I was when I first walked into the hospital to who I am today.

I am only functioning as a person because of the support I received during my treatment. Getting my mobility back has given me a chance at life again.”

Specialist care, delivered at home

Austin Health's Virtual Hospital is helping patients access specialist care from the comfort of home, reducing the need for travel while easing pressure on hospital beds. In just seven months, Austin Health has cared for 450 patients through the program.

For Garry, 70, from Colac, the model has made a significant difference. After presenting to his local hospital with heart failure, he was short of breath, had fluid around his lungs and struggled to walk across his backyard.

Previously, Garry may have needed to travel to a larger city to see a cardiologist. Instead, he received specialist care at home.

Each morning, Garry recorded his weight and blood pressure before speaking with his care team. Over 11 days, a cardiologist, doctor, nurse and pharmacist monitored his progress and adjusted his medication daily, with prescriptions sent directly to his local pharmacy.

What might normally have taken months was managed in days. Garry is now walking half a kilometre and feeling like himself again.

“I can’t praise it highly enough. Being able to stay at home while they checked on me every day and adjusted my treatment made all the difference.”

Delivered in partnership with the Royal Melbourne Hospital, the Virtual Hospital is demonstrating how coordinated care can improve access to specialist services and provide a better experience for patients, wherever they live.

A wrap around moment for the Elasmarr family

You may remember Silvana, PJ’s mum, from our recent ICU Appeal. After Austin Health saved her son’s life, Silvana felt inspired to give back to the community that had supported her family through their most difficult days.

PJ suffered a sudden cardiac arrest at just 22 years old. He too chose to give back by sharing his incredible story of survival in support of our ICU Appeal.

“I hoped my story might change at least one person’s life and highlight the critical work the ICU team does,” PJ says.

Caring for PJ throughout his recovery was not easy, but Silvana says the experience taught her patience, resilience and compassion.

“The nurses and doctors at Austin Hospital supported us through the toughest days of our lives. Most importantly, we felt seen and supported by the staff,” she says.

After PJ shared his experience at an event in July 2025, Silvana realised she wanted to continue making a difference. Eight months later, in March 2026, she began volunteering at Austin Health.

“It felt like a natural next step because it gave me the opportunity to share that same care, empathy and understanding with others,” Silvana says. “Knowing that even a small act of kindness or a little of my time can brighten someone’s day is what continues to inspire me.”

For Silvana, one of the greatest rewards has been forming meaningful connections with patients, hospital staff and fellow volunteers. Whether she is offering a smile, sharing a conversation or simply being there for someone, she knows these moments can have a powerful impact.

PJ remains Silvana’s greatest inspiration and continues to motivate her to give back to others.
