Accredited Training Positions

Infant, Child & Youth Mental Health Service

Clinical Director: Dr Campbell Thorpe

The Austin offers comprehensive training in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry, with a focus on psychodynamic and systems theory, research and education. Inpatient posts are available in each of the Adolescent and Child Inpatient Units, as well as the Statewide Child &



Family Centre, the first of its kind in Victoria.


Opportunities to work with adolescents and youth are available through community, autism assessment and emergency mental health service rotations. In addition to Stage 2 training, the Austin is able to offer a full

Advanced Training Certificate in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry, offered in collaboration with the Mindful Training Centre, Travancore.

Adult Mental Health Services

Austin Health provides services to the North-East Area Mental Health Service, including the Acute Psychiatric Unit, Secure Extended Care Unit, Psychiatric Planning and Assessment Unit (PAPU) and comprehensive community mental health services, including Primary



Mental Health and HOPE teams and the first Victorian Crisis, Assessment & Treatment (CAT) Team. Residential programs at PARC and our Community Recovery Program provide experience in psychosocial rehabilitation.

Parent-Infant & Eating Disorder Services

Parent-infant psychiatry is one of the Austin's biggest drawcards, with five registrar posts available at between the Austin, Northpark and Mercy Hospital for Women. Eating disorders experience is available on our inpatient Eating Disorders Unit, as well as the Body Image & Eating Disorders Treatment & Recovery Service (BETRS); a comprehensive community service, with day program and psychotherapy services.

Consultation-Liaison Psychiatry

The Austin's Consultation-Liaison team provide a comprehensive training experience across all three Austin campuses to both Stage 2 and Advanced Certificate trainees. Notably, the team have a liaison role to Statewide Austin services such as Austin's Liver Transplant Unit, National Epilepsy Service, Long-Term Respiratory Unit and Victorian Spinal Unit, among other specialist services, such as the Olivia Newton-John Cancer Centre. Intersubspecialty training experiences are also available in CL with dual-accredited roles in child and youth CL, old age CL and addiction CL, as well as perinatal CL at the Mercy Hospital for Women, just next door.

Addiction Psychiatry

The training opportunities in addiction psychiatry have been dramatically expanded, and now incorporates a opioid substitution clinic, consultation-liaison opportunities for inpatients, pain clinic, residential withdrawal and the new Hamilton Centre, a Statewide service offering education and support to mental



health services across Northern Victoria. Addiction advanced certificate training is available; trainees will work alongside addiction medicine registrars and physicians to provide integrated dual diagnosis care. Addiction services operate out of our brand new clinic at Burgundy Street.

Statewide Brain Disorders Program (BDP)

Experience in neuropsychiatry is available at the Austin's BDP, including the inpatient Brain Disorder Unit and CBDATS, a statewide community assessment and

outreach service. Outpatient experience is also available in specialist Neurobehaviour Clinics. Our Transition Support Unit supports adults with a dual disability to transition to community living, providing valuable experience in the psychiatry of intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Psychological Trauma Recovery Service (PTRS)

Clinical Director: Dr Charu Gandhi

The PTRS is a unique Statewide service which provides inpatient and outpatient treatment to Defence Force Veterans and Serving Members, emergency services personnel, and civilian victims of trauma. Opportunities



at the PTRS exist for inpatient, psychotherapy, group work, TMS, and specialised PTSD treatments. The PTRS inpatient unit, accredited as a Stage 1 acute adult rotation, allows first year registrars the rare opportunity to develop experience with high prevalence disorders.

Available External Secondments

These include general and AT posts in Aged **Psychiatry**, through Northern Health, Northpark Private Hospital and The Melbourne Clinic, **Forensic Psychiatry** through Forensicare, as are multiple **Private Practice** posts.

Education & Research Opportunities

A weekly education program includes fortnightly Grand Rounds, Professorial Tutorials, Journal Club, psychotherapy tutorials and invited expert presenters. Teaching is supported by academics from our on-site University of Melbourne Department of Psychiatry, including A/Prof Trevor Norman, A/Prof James Olver, and its Chair, Prof Richard Kanaan. Multiple research opportunities are also available for scholarly projects, and for those interested in an academic career. The Austin is committed to registrar exam success, offering a comprehensive RANZCP exam preparation program as well as supervision for the psychotherapy long case and scholarly project.

Junior Medical Staff Support

The Psychiatry JMS Training and Support Unit is staffed by Dr Mark Vella, and Jessica Thomas, who are available to provide RANZCP training, administrative and well-being support for all Mental Health Division junior medical staff. Dr Pam Cooke, Northern Region Director of Training and Dr Lee Allen, Chair of the Victorian Psychiatry Training Committee also make their home at the Austin.
