ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Transition to Specialty Practice: Emergency Department program is designed to immerse nurses into the dynamic world of emergency care. Over 12 months, participants will engage in a blend of study days and hands-on clinical skill development, ensuring they acquire the essential knowledge and competencies for delivering high-quality emergency nursing. The program covers key concepts, including comprehensive patient assessments for both adults and paediatrics, an introduction to ECG interpretation, and advanced high-dependency care skills, such as non-invasive ventilation and the management of haemodynamic monitoring.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Participants will develop and demonstrate the capacity to problem solve and think critically in the Emergency Department clinical environment
- Participants will demonstrate an alignment of clinical and theoretical knowledge while planning and implementing the care of the patient requiring emergency care

- Registered Nurses with minimum of 12 months acute clinical experience
- Registration with Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA)
- Applications from 2024 Graduate Nurse Program participants are welcomed
