Emergency Department: Transition to Specialty Practice



ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Emergency Department: Transition to Specialty practice program is designed to introduce nurses to the emergency care environment. Nurses will attend study days in conjunction with experiential clinical skill development over a 12-month period to equip them with the knowledge and skills required for quality emergency nursing practice. Concepts explored will include comprehensive patient assessment of adults and paediatrics, introduction to ECG interpretation and high dependency nursing care skills, including non-invasive ventilation and management of invasive monitoring.

- Participants will develop and demonstrate the capacity to problem solve and think critically in the Emergency Department clinical environment
- Participants will demonstrate an alignment of clinical and theoretical knowledge while planning and implementing the care of the patient requiring emergency care

- Registration with Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA)
