
Going to Radiology

Social Script




This is the main way to enter the hospital.

You will go through this entry to get to the lifts to the hospital.






You can follow signs to the orange lift area.

You will check in at the desk and then wait in this area for your turn. There will be other people waiting here too.






Having an Magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) Scan




The Radiologist will call your name when it is your turn.

They will show you where to go.








You will go to a changing room to get ready for the MRI scan.

You will change out of your clothes and into a hospital gown.





You will go into a room like this to get ready for the MRI scan.

You will be asked to sign a form to give your consent for the MRI.



Some MRI scans need a contrast dye to make a clear picture.

If you need contrast dye for your MRI, the radiologist will put a cannula into your hand or arm. You may also need to drink a liquid to help take a clear picture.

When you are getting the MRI scan, the radiologist will tell you before they put the contrast dye into the cannula.





When you are ready, you will go into a room with the MRI machine.

You will lie down on the bed, and it will slide into the tube to take pictures of you.

You might be given pillows, straps or braces to help take the pictures.





The MRI machine will be very noisy when it is taking the pictures.

You will be wearing headphones so you can hear the radiologist talking to you.

You will also have a button to push if you want to talk to the radiologist or stop the MRI scan.





When the MRI scan is finished, you will leave Radiology.






Having an Magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) Scan with Sedation



Having an X-Ray





This is the X-Ray room. The radiologist will tell you where to sit, stand or lie down to take the pictures. You might be given a heavy apron to wear depending on the pictures that are being taken.



When the radiologist takes the picture, they will stand behind a wall.

You will need to be still when they are taking the picture so that it is clear.





Having an Ultrasound



This is the ultrasound room.

The radiologist will tell you where to sit or lie down to take the pictures.





The radiologist will put gel on to the area where they will be taking pictures.

They will use a wand to take the pictures.

They will move the wand around and and push on the area to make sure the pictures are clear.
