Pharmacy Department

2024

In 2024, Pharmacy Department staff contributed 40 presentations (papers or posters) at national and international conferences, and 30 publications (28 peer-reviewed journal papers and two commissioned reports). Twenty staff were co-authors on a publication. Once again, several staff were involved in presenting their first conference presentation on the national stage or their first publication. We had three PhD candidates in the department in 2024. [Publication date: February 2025]

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
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Overview

2024 was another strong year for research output from the Pharmacy Department. There were 25 new papers published in peer review journals (and 3 papers included in the 2023 report that were published online ahead of print), 2 commissioned reports prepared for the Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Healthcare, and 40 papers or posters presented at conferences.

The Figure (below) highlights the Department's strong research track record and sustained commitment to quality improvement, with 188 peer reviewed journal papers (median 22.5 per year) and 192 conference papers and posters (median 21.5 per year) since 2017.


Figure. Key measures of Pharmacy Department research output 2017-2024

Several staff presented on the international stage.

Jasmine Lau was invited to present her 2023 residency project at the Hong Kong Pharmacy Conference in February. Her presentation about the design and implementation of a Cardiac Hospital in The Home service was very well received. Links were made with Hong Kong colleagues, some of whom are planning to visit us in 2025.



Also in February, Elise Mitri attended the American Academy of Allergy Asthma and Immunology conference in Washington DC to present her antibiotic allergy de-labelling work that is part of her PhD program in the Department of Infectious Diseases, at Austin Health and Peter Doherty Institute for Infection and Immunity, University of Melbourne. Elise was joined by seven other members of the Austin Health Drug and Antibiotic Allergy Service team, to present new, leading research in the field of antibiotic allergy, and learn about the latest updates in immunology and allergy. Following the conference, Elise and the team presented at the Centre for Drug Safety and Immunology, led by Professor Elizabeth Phillips at Vanderbilt University Medical Centre (VUMC) in Nashville, Tennessee. This opportunity further strengthened research and clinical relationships with Immunology clinicians and Pharmacists at VUMC.



Brett Anderson, formerly of Austin Health, is currently undertaking his PhD through the University of Technology in Sydney, and Simone Taylor is one of his PhD supervisors. His thesis is focused on developing an evidence base for Australian hospital pharmacy technicians in clinical support roles. Brett was awarded an Allied Health travel grant from Melbourne Health to enable him to attend the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists Midyear Clinical Meeting in New Orleans and visit Simone's colleagues at University of Pittsburgh and University of Pittsburgh Medical Center.



Other successes outside of the department

Several of our staff had the opportunity to attend the Medicines Management 2024 (MM2024) conference in Adelaide and present the research and innovations. Elise Mitri was an invited speaker and presented her research on multidisciplinary antibiotic allergy delabelling programs in Australia and internationally. Parnaz Aminian, Zulal Uzunbay and Liz Su delivered oral presentations about consumer pain management education, provision of interim medication administration charts in the emergency department and deprescribing in Aged Care, respectively. Poster presentations demonstrated the breath of work undertaken across the department, including in infectious diseases, general medicine, emergency medicine, intensive care, Better@Home, liver transplant unit and pharmacogenomics. The work stemming from four of our Intern Foundation Program projects was presented at MM2024, and Elise Mitri was recognized as Fellow of Advanced Pharmacy Australia.



Several emergency departments were particularly interested in our outcomes data related to providing an interim medication administration chart to patients who are returning to Aged Care Facilities with medication regimen changes.

Successes within Austin Health

Research Week was held earlier than previously and was done a little differently in 2024. The Cochrane Colloquium poster format was encouraged, and these were printed on A3 pages. Rather than having rooms of A0 posters on boards, poster authors were encouraged to join in the ONJ collaboration space. A microphone was shared around the space with authors given the opportunity to give an 'elevator pitch' about their project and its findings. This was a much more interactive session than in previous years...and there were significant savings in the creation of posters - financial and environmental.

Several staff were invited to deliver an oral presentation at Research Week about their work. Simone Taylor presented an update on the Ramadan project, which won the Consumer Partnership Award in 2023. This was a reminder that projects do not come to an end after prizes are awarded.

Two projects were shortlisted for the Quality Improvement Award: Karen Urbancic presented on the OASSIS study (Oncology antimicrobial stewardship: safe intravenous-to-oral switch and antimicrobial optimisation) and Suzanne El-Naggar presented for the Medicine Optimisation Service and the Aged Care team about the DO-IT Deprescribing project. The DO-IT project was awarded second prize.

Dhineli Perera presented on the "Do no harm" project, about the long-term outcomes of a collaborative Antimicrobial Stewardship program for spinal cord injury patients; this project was short listed for the Allied Health Research Award.

Intern and Honours student projects

Seven Intern Foundation Program projects, two RMIT Honours student group projects and a Monash University Inquiry student group project were supported by the Pharmacy Department in 2024. These projects have generated valuable pilot data for future research. The two RMIT projects will progress to publication in 2025 – one focused on risk factors for euglycaemic ketoacidosis in patients taking SGLT2 inhibitors and the other focused on availability of end-of-life medicines in the community.

Research capacity and training

In 2024, several of our pharmacists involved in quality improvement and research joined our interns to undertake the *Level 1 Quality Improvement training*. Much of the work that we undertake within our department is quality improvement in nature, but we seek to undertake this within a research framework. This approach ensures a methodical process, where issues such as data management and analysis are considered prior to projects commencing. When prior Human Research and Ethics approval is achieved, the work can be presented externally and published in peer reviewed journals. In keeping with this overlap between quality improvement and research, the training emphasised a planned and thoughtful approach, setting SMART goals and discussed ways to present data. This was a fun, team building exercise too!

LOOKING FORWARD

Given that 2024 was a busy year for conference presentations, and in accordance with the typical research cycle, 2025 promises to be a busy year of manuscript writing towards publication. Work has begun on several new projects with a strong consumer co-design focus. We are also continuing to explore electronic platforms for brainstorming, maintaining a repository of project ideas and tracking project progress from the range of project and research active groups across our department, including our Quality Use of Medicines team and Medicines Optimisation Service.
